- ix. Meghan looking into hockey tickets for donations
- x. Set up from 5-6, need 3-4 people maybe do some in advance?
- xi. Man draw table throughout night, and admission table 6-6:30 (Meghan thinks staff will man the draw table), can get gr 6 for concession
- xii. Deadline for donations is Dec 1
- xiii. Clean up 8-8:30

d. Christmas dinner

- Lots of waste last year because of boxes maybe were a better choice when kids were in the classroom. Same amount of money for a buffet lunch
- ii. Leftovers could be donated or distributed
- iii. Grade 1 and 2 can't cut meat asked for things to be cut in boxes
- iv. Meghan liked the boxes for service and for kids who could take leftovers home
- v. Should be able to reduce numbers by a few since some kids don't eat it and some might waste. We will have some vegetarian options as well
