## c) Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser

Selestia did get some quotes for catering -- wanted something at the end of the year for families. Meghan - is it possible to run a spaghetti dinner in conjunction with the grand opening of the little library? Could also have a grade 6 bakesale?

- -Best price from Honkers: \$15.99 for adults for spaghetti, garlic bread. Kids would be \$10.99. Meat sauce is more but we have hamburger we can get donated to them, and it's cheaper to get salad from Costco
- -Would be served number of helpings would depend on amount

- -MUST sell tickets prior, not at the door, to ensure the right amount of food so better to separate from library opening
- -Lots of work. Not asking teachers to do anything but would really love them to be there. Dates would depend on when people can attend
- -Concern if Selestia gets stuck doing too much -- if we put it up on School Cash Online we'll know if we can do it. Grade 6 can help but will need adult help.
- -Whether or not the grade 6s go on their trip before the day, we can invite them to earn money towards it by volunteering
- -Meghan suggests we just put out the message that we are looking to host June 7, need X number of volunteers, and just coordinate from there: Please send Meghan the jobs you are anticipating and how many volunteers. Meghan will make a schedule and send out a call for volunteers
- -Time 5:30?

April 26, we can put online on April 3 -- most schools sell for \$5 or \$6; we pay \$3.50 - one for \$6 or 2 for \$10? LCI Band is selling a box of Krispy Kreme, a dozen for \$20. We should just emphasize in advance how we are doing this and what people are buying.
